Title:	Purchase of Ice Breaker Attachment

BACKGROUND: At the regular meeting of Council held on December 12, 2022 administration prepared an RFD with respect to the purchase of an icebreaker attachment. We mentioned that we had researched the RAIKO Ice Breaker sold by Team Eagle Campbellford Ontario; the Snow Lion sold by INSTA-MIX from Montreal Quebec; and the BLUE GRYB International in Victoriaville Quebec. We also noted that we had received responses with respect to the RAIKO and the Snow Lion but had not heard back on the BLUE GRYB.

Based upon the information we had at the time, an RFD was prepared for the purchase of a RAIKO icebreaker.

DISCUSSION/ALTERNATIVES: We have since discovered that there is an authorized BLUE GRYB dealer in Alberta. Trackway Industries, located in Sturgeon County, has provided us with pricing for a used unit along with the cost of purchasing a new one.

We were also able to rent a demo BLUE GRYB from them. Public works have used this on a number of streets (51 Avenue from Eckford Street to 51 Street and 51 Street from Railway Avenue to 54 Avenue to name a couple) with very good results. The demo has a working width of 48 inches, however, we feel it would be more efficient to move up to the 68 inch model.

As we noted in December, the Snow Lion was quite expensive, starting at \$40,000 plus tax and shipping.

Based on the information we had at the time, Council passed a motion on December 12, 2022 to purchase a RAIKO T-7 icebreaker, which has a working area of 47.6 inches, for \$33,000 (\$27,550 plus up to \$5,450 shipping).

The quotes received for the BLUE GRYB were \$23,679 for a new 48 inch machine and \$34,749 for a new 68 inch machine. We would also be able to save on shipping costs since we could pick up the new machine from the dealer.

After learning that the BLUE GRYB can be purchased from a dealer in Alberta who can also provide any required servicing administration is recommending that Council rescind the earlier motion to purchase a RAIKO T-7 icebreaker and pass a new motion to purchase a new 68 inch BLUE GRYB for \$34,749 plus GST.

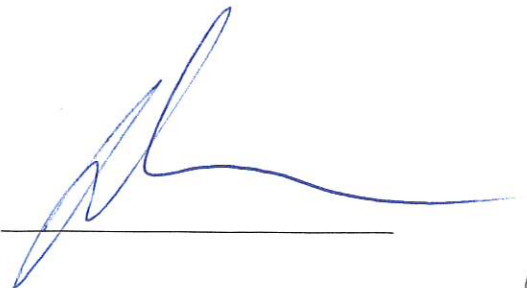

Current Activities:

- **Water Pump House Upgrade Project:** Nothing further to report other than to note that we are in the final stages of installing our lab counters and sink in the main area of the pump house.
- **Snow & Ice Removal:** If you get a chance, please look at the following streets before the January 9th council meeting as we will be talking about Ice Breakers again. 54th Street Close – from 50th Avenue north to the close; 53rd Street – from 50th Avenue to 54th Avenue; 51st Street – from 50th Avenue to the Arena; 51st Avenue from Main Street to 51st Street; and Main Street from 50th Avenue north.

Purchase of Ice Breaker: Please see Request for Decision in agenda.

- **Wastewater Treatment Upgrade Options:** We have held an initial meeting with the Team at MNP on December 7th and work has now started. We continue to forward information to MNP so that they can start analyzing the two options. We will keep you informed on the progress of this important study.

Future / Planned Activities:

- **Wastewater Treatment Upgrade Options:** Work is ongoing. We will report verbally at the January 9th council meeting.
- **Wastewater Testing:** We have been taking our weekly effluent samples to Central Labs in Burnt Lake for just over a month and so far things are working out nicely.
- **Highway 11 Twinning, Functional Planning Study – Highway to Township Road 390 (east of Benalto):** Nothing to report currently. Assuming we will have a virtual meeting soon.
- **Replotting of Westview Lots:** We are finally moving ahead with this project. We will be bringing an application to the Municipal Planning Commission, who also act as our Subdivision Authority, in the next few weeks. In the meantime, you may see surveyors from Bemoco Surveys placing some new pins in the ground to mark the new lots.

Management Report – January 9, 2023

Information Items:

- **Lacombe Foundation 2023 Requisition:** Please find attached correspondence from the Bethany Group, CEO for the Lacombe Foundation. Also attached is our 2023 Lodge Requisition in the amount of \$8,293. This is up from \$6,870 in 2022.

The Board approved budget reflects a cautious approach to revenues. Occupancy has been projected lower than the three-year average, recognizing the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic is still being felt by seniors housing operators across the province. Additionally, provincial Covid-19 support funding for occupancy loss is not anticipated in 2023. The requisition represents 16.7 % of total revenues.

Expenses reflect inflationary pressures in the areas of salaries, food costs, natural gas and carbon tax, general operating and maintenance costs. The projected deficit of \$185,351 will be addressed with retained earnings. Updated reserve policies are being developed and will be circulated once complete.

Prior to 2020, Lacombe Foundation had been directing annual surplus funds to a restricted reserve to support the Lacombe Lodge redevelopment project. Current forecasts do not anticipate additional funds being directed to this reserve in 2023 as the organization focuses on addressing operational pressures. The Board continues to advocate for provincial funding for the Lodge redevelopment proposal. It is of note that included in the budget is window replacement for the D-wing of the Lacombe Lodge. This repair can no longer wait for a capital funding announcement.

Lacombe Seniors Lodge and Eckville Manor remain important to the health and wellbeing of the Seniors who live in the Lacombe County service area. Both sites continue to be operated with a focus on the quality of life for residents through the most efficient operations possible and provide a strong working environment for local community members.

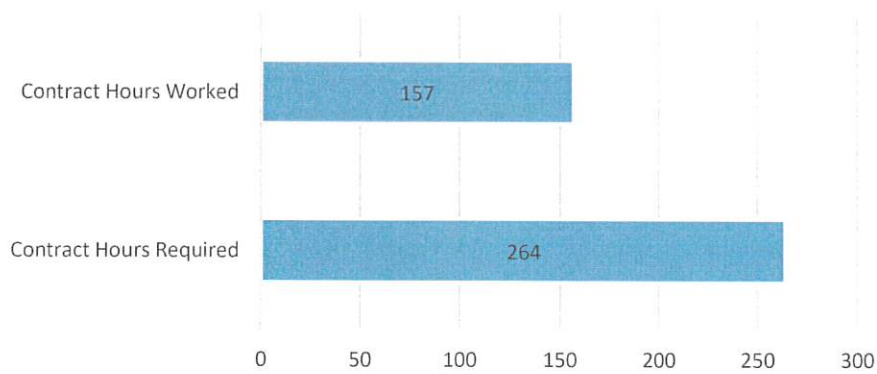

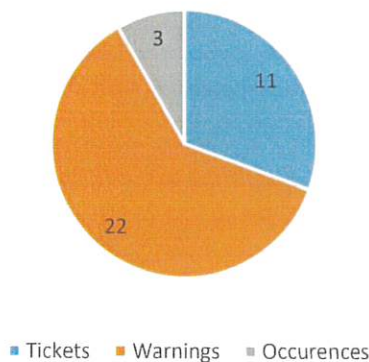

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING December 8, 2022

ROAD PROJECT C0322 – PETITION

The 2022-2026 Road Construction Schedule included the 0.8 km section of Rge. Rd. 3-2 from Twp. Rd. 39-2 (Project C0322). On August 1, 2022, Lacombe County received a petition with 22 signatures of local landowners requesting Council consider the removal of project C0322 from the Road Construction Schedule. By resolution of Council the 2022-2026 Road Construction Schedule was amended by removing project C0322.

MEDICINE LODGE SKI HILL MASTER PLAN

Central Alberta Economic Partnership (CAEP), in collaboration with the Medicine Lodge Ski Club, the Town of Bentley and Lacombe Regional Tourism wishes to submit a grant application to the Federal Tourism Relief Fund (TRF) to seek funding to support the development of an asset utilization plan (master plan) for the Medicine Lodge Ski Hill.

As per a request from the Town of Bentley, subject to the Medicine Lodge Ski Hill master plan proceeding, Lacombe County will contribute 25% of the cost of completing this plan, to a maximum of \$25,000.

MOTZ - TAX CANCELLATION REQUEST

A motion that Lacombe County cancel the \$ 349.21 late payment penalty levied on tax account #4026273003 did not receive Council approval.

KEATS - TAX CANCELLATION REQUEST

A motion that Lacombe County cancel the \$ 80.19 late payment penalty levied on tax account #4101015047 received Council approval.

POLICY RC(9) COUNTY SUPPORT OF COMMUNITY PROGRAMS, EVENTS & ACTIVITIES

As per Policy RC(9) County Support of Community Programs, Events and Activities funding in the amount of \$ 850 was approved for the Wilson's Beach Estates Christmas Parade.

TAXATION EXTENTION/ANNEXATION REQUEST

A request from a landowner that Lacombe County support his request to the Town of Blackfalds that the 15-year Lacombe County taxation rate applied to his property legally described as Pt. NE 36-39-27 W4M authorized under annexation Board Order No. MGB 01609 be extended to 99 years, or until development should occur; and furthermore, if the taxation rate is not extended that Lacombe County annex the subject property into the County, was not supported by Council.

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

The following recommendations from the Committee of the Whole meeting held on November 29, 2022 received the approval of Council:

- *That the County Manager was directed to amend Policy OP(2) Road Construction Programs to identify the criteria for removing projects from the Road Construction Program.*

The Ministries of Alberta Justice and Public Security and Emergency Services are excited to be starting virtual stakeholder engagement on Community Justice Centre's (CJC) in early 2023.

CJCs are places where justice processes are integrated with health and social services to facilitate a coordinated approach that more effectively addresses the root causes of crime, breaks the cycle of re-offending, and improves public safety and community well-being. CJCs can take on a physical form where a "brick and mortar" location unites the court, justice programs, and local social services, or a virtual form that offers better integration of justice initiatives and community services.

The design of CJCs needs to be driven by communities, providing the ability to directly address the unique challenges they face, and being informed by their own priorities and cultural protocols. These conversations will inform a report back to the federal government and may inform the establishment of CJCs in Alberta in the future.

In-person engagement and conversations occurred between September 2022 and November 2022, held in medium-sized, rural and Indigenous communities throughout Alberta. Elected and unelected community leaders, governmental and community-based organizations shared to CJCs could work within their specific contexts and potential challenges to ensuring this concept's success.

Two-hour engagement sessions will focus on key themes to enable you to make recommendations on what CJsCs could and should look like. While these virtual sessions were designed for large urban centres, all are welcome to attend if interested or you missed your in-person community session. You are invited to self-determine whether to attend all, or specific topics of your choosing.

The engagement sessions will explore the concepts of CJsCs, gather feedback on these ideas that will then be used to refine the CJC proposed model and inform federal government decision making. 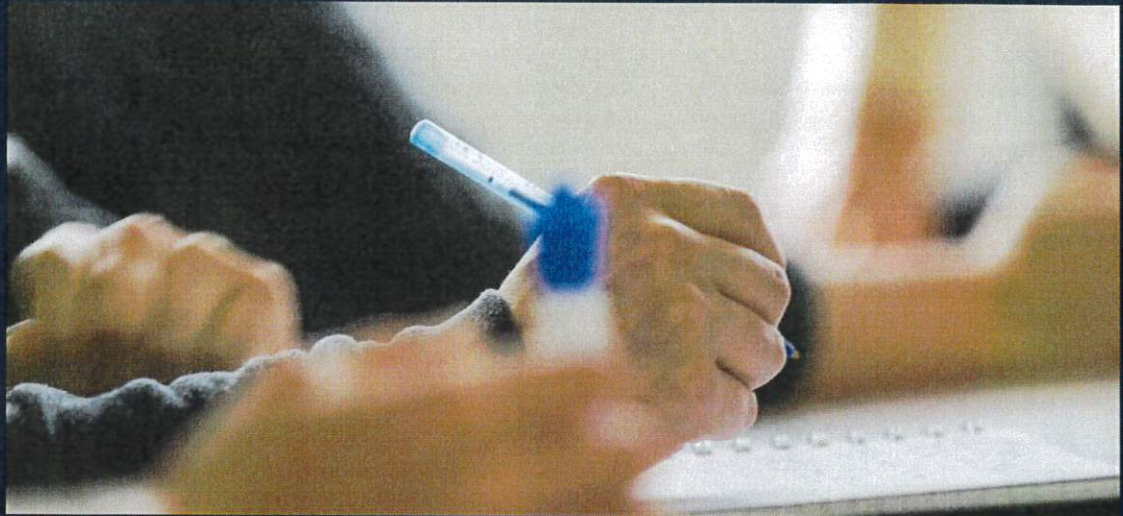
